So, scenes are starting to be handed out in acting classes, and you really need that 18th century Victorian corset and skirt for your scene- what do you do? Don't worry about going to your great - grandmother's attic- just call the costume shop. Yes, the costume shop and the prop room are not just for main stage show purposes only. Just follow these simple guidelines and Patti (Costume Shop Manager) and Tom (Costume Shop Foreman) and the Prop Boys will be able to help you out.

The Costume Shop is located in the 14th Street Building (1415 S. Wabash) - that's rightput on your walking shoes during the hours of 3:00-5:30 on Tuesdays and Wednesdays or 11:00-3:00 on Fridays and the costume shop will be able to help you out. If you can't make any of those times, you can call 312.344.6605 for an appointment. Be sure to have a valid and current Columbia ID, as well as a note from your instructor.(Your instructor might have sent a blanket note for the class- so double check with them.) Once you have looked at the scene, do some research for the year or the setting that the play takes place in. If you can't find any books in the library for references, the

costume shop has some that might be able to help you. You need to come to the costume shop knowing what you are looking for. Patti and Tom, or any of the other costume shop staff will then be able to help you.

As for the Prop Room check out policy, you just need a valid and current Columbia ID. The Prop Room hours have not been determined yet, so look for them to be posted on the doors of the room, which is located on the 3rd floor of the 11th Street building.

Don't wait until the day of, or even three days before you need anything for your scene. If you do and the costume shop or the prop shop can't help youthen it's your problem!
