OUR DEMANDS

- THE RELEASE OF THE 13 LEADERS CHARGED UNDER SECTION 29 OF SOUTH AFRICA'S INTERNAL SECURITY ACT OF 1982, AN ACT WHICH REQUIRES NEITHER CHARGE NOR TRIAL AND HAS ALREADY RESULTED IN THE DEATH OF NO LESS THAN 64 POLITICAL PRISONERS
- THE RELEASE OF THE LEGITIMATE LEADERS OF THE SOUTH AFRICAN PEOPLE (NELSON MANDELA, WALTER SISULU AND OTHERS) WHO HAVE BEEN LANGUISHING IN SOUTH AFRICAN PRISONS FOR DECADES
- THE START OF GOOD FAITH NEGOTIATIONS BETWEEN THESE RELEASED LEADERS AND THE SOUTH AFRICAN GOVERNMENT, BOTH ON THE GRIEVANCES WHICH PROMPTED THE MOST RECENT OUTBREAKS OF VIOLENCE, AS WELL AS THE ONGOING DENIAL OF POWER SHARING TO THE BLACK MAJORITY IN SOUTH AFRICA
- THE ABANDONMENT OF THIS NATION'S ACCOMODATIONIST POLICY OF "CONSTRUCTIVE ENGAGEMENT" TOWARD THE REPUBLIC OF SOUTH AFRICA
