CONSTITUTION

Article 1—This Society shall be known as The Phi Sigma.

Article 2—The officers shall consist of a President, two Vice Presidents, a Secretary who shall also act as Treasurer, and an Executive Committee.

Article 3—The Executive Committee shall consist of the President, the Vice Presidents, ~~and~~ ^{Secretary & Treasurer} two others, who shall be elected by the Society. No officer may succeed himself except the Secretary.

Article 4—The duties of the President, Vice President, Secretary and Treasurer shall be such as usually devolve upon such officers.

Article 5—The Executive Committee shall have charge of the business and exercises of the society, and all business matters shall be submitted to this Committee in writing before being presented to the Society. Reports of officers and committees may be called for at any meeting.

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Article 6—Any person may be proposed for membership at any regular meeting. Such proposal shall be referred to the Executive Committee, whose recommendation shall precede an election. The election of members shall be by ballot, three negative votes rejecting.

Article 7—Fifteen members shall constitute a quorum to transact business.

Article 8—The Constitution and By-Laws may be amended at any meeting of the Society; notice of such amendments having been submitted in writing to the Executive Committee, at any previous regular meeting, and its report on the advisability of such changes having been made to the Society.

Article 9—There may be a list of members known as Honorary Members, whose election shall be by ballot and shall require an unanimous vote of all members present at any regular meeting. No dues shall be required of such Honorary Members and they shall not have a vote in the Society.

BY-LAWS

Article 1—The Phi Sigma shall hold meetings monthly from October to May inclusive. The meetings shall be held the fourth Tuesday evening of the month, subject to temporary change by the Executive Committee. Extra meetings may be called by the President or Executive Committee.

Article 2—As soon as practicable after the annual meeting the Executive Committee shall present to the class the outline of the program for the ensuing year. After adoption by the Society the program shall be the basis for the year's work.

Article 3—Meetings of the Society shall commence promptly at 8:15 p. m. and the literary exercise shall close at 9:45 o'clock.

Article 4—The annual election of officers shall be held at the April meeting.

Article 5—Annual dues of \$1.00 per member shall be payable in advance at the May meeting.

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Article 6—All election of officers shall be by ballot. All nominations shall be by informal ballot.

Article 7—Members absenting themselves from three consecutive meetings, without sending to the Secretary valid reasons shall be considered to have tendered their resignation. ✓
