Before March, January 25, 2020, Pandemic coming

Personal events: Chinese Spring Festival, there is a huge shortage of medical masks in China.

March 13, 2020, Reflection

Local events: Vermont Governor declared a state of emergency to help ensure Vermont has all the necessary resources to respond to the COVID-19.

First positive case in Vermont.

March 14, 2020, Discrimination and ignoration

Personal events: College closed and all classes turned to online. My Chinese friends were discriminated against and laughed by some locals when they wore masks and bought instant food. Optimistically, Chinese and even Asian people discriminate, and finally no longer only say "squint" such a monotonous discriminatory statement.

March 22, 2020, Shortage

National events: Health authorities have recommended stopping testing of non-hospitalized patients because of a lack of protective equipment among medical staff in New York. In those days, I could always find conspiracy theories online, such as that New York City had completely fallen and that the dead were being taken away in military trucks every night and centralized. This narrative terrified me just as much as the concentration camps once did, and perhaps at the time I thought I would be part of the bus.

April 1, 2020, Turmoil

International event:

Tokyo, Japan will close schools until early May.

Zhong Nanshan, the "supreme commander" in a war against the coronavirus, mentioned The outbreak in China will be completely controlled by the end of April. a day and more than 5.4 million cases nationwide. Even though the death rate in the U.S. is eight

times higher than in Europe, the number of tests performed per day has dropped by an average of

68,000.

April 2, 2021, Attack


