

WALTER A. ERLEY 1893-1980

This afternoon's concert is dedicated to the memory of Walter A. Erley, President of Sherwood Music School from 1943 until his death at the age of eighty-eight.

Earning a master of science degree in engineering from the University of Michigan, he worked in the automotive industry in Detroit before joining the management of the school in the mid-twenties. His technical and business background, coupled with a lifelong love of music, made him an able administrator and he contributed his expertise freely to many musical organizations.

His vigorous, healthy appearance and quick wit made him seem far younger than his years. He remained active and faithfully served the school until the end. He was especially devoted to his family and is survived by his wife of nearly sixty years, Marian, four sons, fifteen grandchildren, and four great-grandchildren.

GIULIO FAVARIO - conductor, pianist and vocal coach, has earned a renowned reputation as Chorus Master of the Lyric Opera of Chicago, and is also a member of the faculties of Sherwood Music School, where he received his Master's Degree, and the Lyric Opera School. He has conducted numerous operatic and ballet programs for the Lyric Opera, and has filled many engagements as guest conductor with other opera companies in Chicago. As a pianist he has toured extensively, and is a well known recitalist.

#### - Soloists -

DR. FRANCOIS D'ALBERT - violinist, is a member of the faculties of Sherwood Music School and Governors State University. He has had a distinguished career as a soloist and composer, having appeared in over five thousand concerts throughout Europe, Canada and the U.S.

JUSTIN PAGE - pianist, is a graduate of Sherwood Music School where he studied with Leon Rosenbloom and Herbert Renison. He recently completed a Master's Degree at Northwestern University, studying with Gui Mombaerts. A member of the piano and theory faculty of Sherwood, he has also been affiliated with the Civic Orchestra of Chicago for five years. This season he appeared as pianist in the Chicago production of the ballet, "The Nutcracker".

PHYLLIS POPE - soprano, is a scholarship student of Marion Schroeder at Sherwood, and is a candidate for the degree, Bachelor of Music, to be conferred this spring.

BRYAN SHILANDER - pianist, is a graduate and faculty member of Sherwood Music School, and has recently joined the administration of the school. He has for many years been a student with Dr. Leo Podolsky at Sherwood, and has appeared in numerous recitals in Chicago, Cleveland, Pittsburgh, Los Angeles, San Diego, Toronto and Mexico City.
